The Engineering Society of Buffalo was organized in 1894 and incorporated in 1920. Currently there are approximately 150 in the Society. These members represent the full spectrum of engineering disciplines; technicians, educators, as well as owners of businesses in engineering activities. The ESB aims to foster and promote engineering knowledge and education.

Currently, the ESB supports 20 students in their scholarship program. The students are from the State University of New York at Buffalo, and Erie and Niagara County Community College.

Funds to support these scholarships are generated by direct contributions, income from investment of endowment funds and the annual scholarship run.

The Society employs an office administrator.

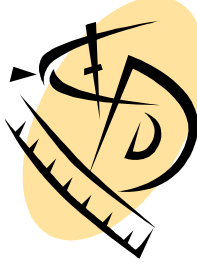
